## Release of Reckonyard Gold 2006 Pinot Noir Sharing Wine for Scholarships

Earth Day marks the long-anticipated release of the results of our 2006 crush of pinot noir from the DeSoto Gardens block now in its fifth season of production at Grace Town Vineyards. The sharing wine will be presented to holders of "futures" secured in late 2006 in support of the Woodinville Rotary Club scholarship program.

Proceeds from the issuing of these "futures" for 2007 will help increase the value of viticulture and enology scholarships in 2009 to \$3,000 each at Washington State University and Walla Walla Community College.

The scholarships and an endowment to insure future grants are made possible by funds derived from the production of the famed Grace Town Vineyards wines, from the planting of the new vines at Molbak's Plant Farm and from the food and wine pairing benefit dinner sponsored by the Greater Grace Wine Appreciation Society. The 2009 scholarships will be given in memory of Woodinville winemaker Lance Baer, past chair of Woodinville Wine Country, and in memory of Stan Clarke, director of the viticulture and enology institute at Walla Walla Community College and a major lifelong player in the state's wine industry.

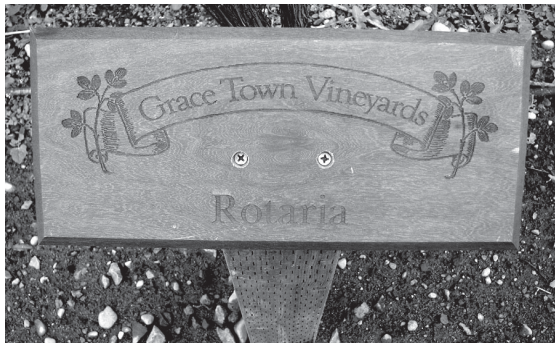
On Earth Day 2008, we will expand Grace Town Vineyards to this special, high visibility location. The terroir has been deemed exceptional for this varietal.
